Applications will be processed on a first come, first serve basis. To reserve a spot for your camper, please print and complete camp application and waiver and send payment as soon as possible.

Forms & payment MUST BE RECEIVED BY JUNE 1ST. NO APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER JUNE 1ST.

Cabins will be separated based on age. Activities, small groups discussions, and teaching will be age appropriate.

- **PLEASE PLAN TO LABEL ALL** of your camper's belongings (clothing, towels, Bible, etc). Many campers wear the same size/style clothing and underwear. Labeling helps insure items are returned to the correct owner.) Any items not claimed two weeks after departure will be donated or discarded.

- **Cell phones** are not allowed. We have a camp phone that the campers can use or parents/guardians can call in case of an emergency. The number is (662) 258-7545. Campers will be allowed to call home if they are homesick.

- If your camper needs to be picked up early or needs to leave the property for any reason, this must be prearranged. We need to know who will be picking the camper up and what time they will be returning to camp. Please notify the camp director at check-in or contact the camp at the number above.

- We will provide two snacks a day so please do not send additional snacks. If your camper has a dietary need and they need a snack at a certain time, please inform the director of this at registration.

- Camper must be able to wash his/her hair standing up in a shower and use the restroom unassisted.

- All campers should be prepared to participate in **ALL** activities and are expected to follow **ALL** camp rules. If camper is uncooperative or defiant, he/she will be sent home immediately.

IMPORTANT COVID-19 INFO

We have been carefully monitoring local, state, and national health and safety mandates so that we may continue with camps and take appropriate action for the overall safety of our campers, staff, and community as it pertains to COVID-19. We will continue to monitor CDC guidelines and update our safety protocols and procedures as necessary, appropriate, or feasible. The following represents an overview of what Dorroh Lake will do to help keep everyone as safe as possible:

****Any camper with any exposure to COVID-19 or symptoms will not be allowed to attend camp.****

Arrival:

- Only **one adult** will be permitted to enter camp while dropping off a camper.
- Each camper will be **asked basic health questions upon arrival** (similar to prescreening forms at doctors/dentists offices) regarding COVID-19 and to confirm that no symptoms are present.
- Each camper and adult will have their **temperature taken upon arrival**. Any camper with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher will not be allowed to attend camp.
- Any camper or adult with any exposure to COVID-19 or symptoms will not be allowed to enter camp.**

Operational Procedures:

- Healthy camper procedures will be presented at orientation including proper cough/sneeze etiquette, hand-washing, and sanitizing. Educational signage will be placed around the campus to inform and remind campers of these procedures.
- All staff, personnel, and campers will have their temperatures taken daily. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 degrees or higher will be sent home immediately.
- Hand sanitizing stations will be placed in multiple locations throughout the campus.
- All food service areas, facility entrances, recreation areas, and all high-touch areas will continually be disinfected.
- Disposable paper products will be used for all food services.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK & WAIVER OF LIABILITY

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. **COVID-19 is extremely contagious** and is believed to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. As a result, federal, state, and local governments and federal and state health agencies recommend social distancing and have, in many locations, prohibited the congregation of groups of people.

Dorroh Lake Baptist Assembly has put in place preventative measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19; however, **we cannot guarantee that you or your child(ren) will not become infected with COVID-19.** Further, **attending camps could increase your risk and your child(ren)'s risk of contracting COVID-19.**



By signing this agreement, I acknowledge the contagious nature of COVID-19 and voluntarily assume the risk that my child(ren) and I may be exposed to or infected by COVID-19 by attending Dorroh Lake Camp and that such exposure or infection may result in personal injury, illness, permanent disability, and death. I voluntarily agree to assume all of the foregoing risks and accept sole responsibility for any injury to my child(ren) or myself (including, but not limited to, personal injury, disability, and death), illness, damage, loss, claim, liability, or expense, of any kind, that I or my child(ren) may experience or incur in connection with my child(ren)'s attendance at Dorroh Lake Camp or participation in Dorroh Lake programming ("Claims"). On my behalf, and on behalf of my children, I hereby release, covenant not to sue, discharge, and hold harmless Dorroh Lake, its employees, agents, and representatives, of and from the Claims, including all liabilities, claims, actions, damages, costs or expenses of any kind arising out of or relating thereto. DOs & DON'Ts

THINGS NOT TO BRING:

- Electronic devices:**
 - cell phones
 - iPods
 - mp3 players
 - portable TV/DVD players
 - laptops
 - video games
 - hairdryers
 - straighteners
- Inappropriate clothing:** Even as an all-girls or all-boys camp, our desire is to honor God with our bodies and reflect modesty toward other campers, staff, volunteers, and guests of Dorroh Lake.
Clothes not permitted are:
 - revealing tank tops
 - 'short' shorts or skirts
 - bikinis or 2-piece swimsuits (unless covered by a dark t-shirt)
